- To qualify, you must secure a minimum score of 42 marks in each section of the CBAT.



- The RRB ALP recruitment process comprises several stages: CBT 1, CBT 2, CBAT, Document Verification, and Medical Examination.
- CBT 1 serves as a screening exam, used to shortlist eligible candidates for CBT 2 based on their normalized marks and merit.
- The minimum pass percentage will be for UR and EWS 40%, OBC (NCL) 30%, SC 30% and ST 25%.
- In CBT 2, you'll face a total of 175 questions and your time allotted will be 2 hours 30 minutes. Moreover, it's split into two parts i.e. Part A and Part B.
- You will be shortlisted for the Computer Based Aptitude Test (CBAT) based on the marks obtained in Part A of CBT 2.

- If you are among the shortlisted candidates, you will need to present your vision certificate in the prescribed format in its original during the CBAT.
